OCTOBER CALENDAR:

A NOTE FROM THE

NYC DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE:

For schools with enrollments of 400 students or fewer and a school nurse, DOHMH will make available H1N1 vaccine and ancillary vaccination supplies, provided the school has refrigerator storage capacity and a refrigerator thermometer. For schools without school nurses and schools with enrollments greater than 400 students, DOHMH is planning to provide this service through on-site vaccination teams, provided the school has a minimum of 50 signed parental consents. Parents of children who are not vaccinated in school can find information about other sites where they can be vaccinated by calling 311 in New York City or visit www.nyc.gov/flu

TERRA NOVA TESTS:

Will be administered to **grades 1 through 8**, Tuesday, October 13 through Friday, October 16. This is not a test they can study for. The Terra Nova

test shows your child's strengths and weaknesses. The weaknesses could reflect that your child did not understand <u>or</u> that part of the curriculum was never taught. This test is a measuring rod for the teacher. It shows the teacher in what area your child needs more preparation and help. This test does not test your child's I.Q. and it does not tell you how smart he/she is.

Our second meeting is scheduled for **Thursday**, **October 15.** We urge every parent or guardian to attend this and every P.T.A. meeting. There are always interesting topics that are covered and discussed and we need your input.
