From the desk of Mrs. McLaughlin - Social Studies 5th - 8th

5TH AND 6TH GRADE

The students have been learning how the first "Americans" may have arrived in the Western Hemisphere. They have learned about the Native Americans in South America and the Native Americans of North America. They have learned about the customs, religions, cultures, clothing and food of these different peoples.



7TH AND 8TH GRADE

The students have also learned about the arrival of the first Americans, but in more detail and with emphasis on the different explorers/conquistadors. The students also learned about the beginning of the slave trade. They wrote short stories in the first person as captured Africans being taken from their homes. The wonderfully written stories are on display in the hallway in the lower level, please stop by and read them.

Fifth through Eighth grade will be learning more about settling our first 13 colonies in the coming weeks.
